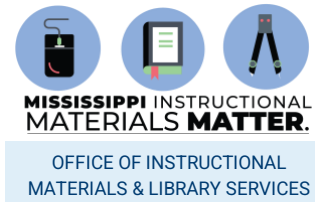


2024 VISUAL ARTS TEXTBOOK ADOPTION REPORT
